American Legions Scholarships: Must be mailed by 4/20.

1. If you, your parent, grandparent, or great grandparent is a member of or auxillary member of The American Legion or its affiliated organizations, apply for the \$750 Charles L. Bacon Scholarship.
2. Education majors: If your parent, grandparent, or great grandparent served 90 days active duty and was honorably discharged, apply for the \$750
3. If you attended boys or girls state and are descendent of a veteran, apply for the Joseph J. Frank \$750 scholarship
4. If you attended boys or girls state or cadet patrol academy and are the descendent of a veteran, apply for the \$1000 Lillie Louis Ford scholarship.

If you plan to become an RN and are the descendent of a veteran and are in the top 40% of your class, apply for the \$1000 M.D. "Jack" Murphy scholarship

FAFSA season is almost over. If you haven't filed your 18/19 FAFSA yet, make it a priority. Your FAFSA should be filed by your college's FAFSA deadline, or the Access Missouri final deadline of April 2, whichever comes first. Eligible students who apply between Feb 1 and April 2 will receive a grant if funds are available. The sooner you file the better!

NOW is the time to finalize your plans for after graduation. Most colleges ask that you let them know of your intent to enroll by May 1.

NEVER stop searching for scholarships. Every scholarship received helps offset your out-of-pocket expenses. College costs will add up – be diligent in your scholarship search now and all throughout college.

Seniors going to a 2-or-4-year college in a construction-related field such as HVAC, plumbing, construction management, excavating, etc.: Apply for the Home Builders of Central Mo scholarship and return by April 1. Two \$1000 scholarships will be given. Mueller has the form.

Seniors who have played a sport for 3 years and lettered for 2: Pick up the Angela Berhorst Memorial Scholarship form for a chance at a \$300 scholarship. April 1 deadline.
