Class Changes: From Now until January 4th students can make changes to their second semester schedules without permission from teachers. So if your child is in a class he or she doesn't particularly like, and if that class is not required to graduate, encourage the child to talk to me about possible changes to the schedule.

After Jan 4 any class changes will require the permission of the teachers, the parents, and the principal.

Winter Break: Our last day of school will be Friday, Dec 21 with an 11:20 dismissal. Students will return on Thursday, Jan 3.

Others depend on the school you will go to and the major you will have. So if you know the college you will attend, check out their transfer credit forms to see if your classes will count!
